


Did you know that Sugar Grove has a Historical Society? It sure does! It is located at 259 S. Main Street. The house that sits at this address was not built there, it was moved there! It is called the Bliss House, and was originally built between 1838-1839 at the intersection of Bliss and Merrill. P.Y Bliss built this home to be a residence and store. Mr. Bliss filled the store with items that were in demand by the settlers of that time. According to Mr. Bliss, the annual sales exceeded those of any other in the county by thousands of dollars which was an astounding accomplishment for that day. Later, the combination home and store was moved across the road (on Bliss) from the prominent corner so Mr. Bliss' son Harrison could build a larger, grander home on the site. In 1997 the home had a second move to its current location at 259 Main Street. It took five years to get the building in shape before it opened as a museum in 2002.

There are lots of stories to be told about Sugar Grove. We will try sharing some with you every-other month.
