

At the March meeting in the Community House,

I heard some one wondering who the couple were in the picture over the fireplace. I looked it up:

The Women's Club Room was dedicated to the memory of David Crawford who was township supervisor from 1896 to i900. The \$1,000 gift from Mr. and Mrs. Crawford originally spurred the idea for the building of the Community House.

SUGAR GROVE SERVED THE STATE FAIR IN 1872

In the summer of 1842 the members of the Farmers Institute were asked to furnish food to visitors at the second annual Illinois State Fair being held in Aurora.

The wives of the members of the Institute, cooked the meats on the hearths of their log cabin homes. A steer was butchered and a generous number of chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys, as well as lambs and pigs were roasted in the flames of these primitive fire-places in the homes of Sugar Grove Township.

Vegetables-potatoes, turnips, and onions were prepared in caldron kettles, and tea and coffee were






brewed in four-pail brass kettles hung on long poles on the open prairie near the site of judge Parks' residence.

500 guests were seated and many more stood eating. Much food was left over and given to the poor.



The Sugar Grove Fire Protection District was organized June 25, 1942. The fire station was built on land donated by Mrs. Theresa Keck. This picture was taken in 1953. Delmar Krieghbaum was Fire Chief and assistant chiefs were Deverl Hartman, Groff Frantz and Cecil Runkle.



The fire department moved to the north end of Main Street in August 1973. It was still a volunteer Fire Department with 35 members. It was run for many years without raising the tax rate.



Today's fire barn was first built with three bays and now has four bays. It is now on Municipal Drive just south of Rt. 30 at the west end of town.




