Examining board. SEC. 7. Said corporation shall have power to institute a board of competent persons, always including the faculty, who shall examine such individuals as may apply; and if said applicants are found to possess such knowledge, pursued in said university, as in the judgment of said board, renders them worthy, they may be considered graduates in course, and shall be entitled to a diploma accordingly, on paying such fee as the corporation shall affix, which fee, however, shall in no case exceed the tuition bills of the full course of studies in said university. Said examining board may not exceed the number of ten, three of whom may transact business, provided one be of the faculty.

Sec. 8. Should the corporation at any time act contrary to the provisions of this charter, or fail to comply with the same, upon complaint being made to the circuit court of Cook county, a scire facias shall issue, and the circuit attorney shall prosecute in behalf of the people of this State for a forfeiture of this charter.

This act shall be a public act, and shall be construed liberally in all courts for the purposes hereinbefore expressed. Approved, December 23, 1844.

AN ACT providing for partial appropriations.

In force, represented in the General Assembly, That the Auditor of Public Accounts be required to issue warrants to the amount of one hundred dollars to each of the members of the General Assembly, to the Speaker, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Engrossing and Enrolling Clerk, and Door-keeper of the Senate; the Speaker, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Engrossing and Enrolling Clerk, and Door-keepers of the House of Representations.

AN ACT to locate a State road from Little Rock in Knne county, to the steam mill bridge on the Des Plaines river in Cook county.

In force, Jan. 21, 1845.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly, That Peleg Y. Bliss of Kane county, Hiram E. Leonard and Edward Eldridge of Du Page county, be, and the same are hereby appointed commissioners, to view, survey, mark and locate a State road from Little Rock, Kane county, crossing Fox river near Snider's mill in said county, and terminate at the steam mill bridge on the Des Plaines river in Cookgounty.

Cem'rs. appointed.

SEC. 2. The said commissioners, or a majority of them shall meet at Bliss's store in Sugar Grove, Kane county, on the first Monday in April or within four months thereafter, and after

being duly sworn before some justice of the peace faithfully to discharge their duties according to the provisions of this act, shall proceed to view, mark, survey and locate said road Duty of comon the nearest and most eligible ground from point to point, missioners. having due regard to private property and public convenience, and shall make return to the county commissioners' courts of the several counties through which the same shall pass, which return shall be entered of record and filed in the office of the county commissioners' courts, and said road shall be a public and State road and kept in repair as other State roads are.

SEC. 3. The said commissioners, surveyor and assistants shall receive such compensation for their services as the county commissioners' courts of the several counties through which said road shall pass, shall deem right and proper.

AN ACT to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin Literary and Medical Inforce,
Feb. 7, 1845.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of I/linois, Certain perrepresented in the General Assembly, That Joseph Johnson, to be a body Horatio Newhall, Abner Eads, John Dement, Henry J. Mor-corporate and rison, Benjamin C. St. Cyr, Nicholas Dowling and their asso. Politic. ciates and successors, be, and are hereby created a body politic and corporate, under the name and style of "the Franklin style. Literary and Medical College of Illinois, if to be located in the City of Galena, and by that name to remain in succession for Where located the term of fifty years, with full powers to acquire by purchase, devise, gift or bequest, any property, real, personal or mixed, and to hold or convey the same under a common seal, which they may alter or change at pleasure, in any way consistent with the interest of said corporation.

Sec. 2. That said trustees in their corporate capacity, may Trustees may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in all the courts of sue and be this State, and have power to make such by-laws and regulations as they may deem necessary for the good government of themselves or the officers and students of the college; Provi. Proviso. ded, that such by-laws shall in no way conflict with the constitution or laws of this State and of the United States.

SEC. 3. That a majority of said trustees shall form a quorum to do business and shall choose a president and secretary Trustees to and other officers, professors of the sciences, and agents of the choose officers institution, to displace entirely, or remove to other departments any or all of them, for good and sufficient reasons; and shall, with the advice and consent of the president, prescribe the course of study to be pursued in each department Course of of the college, and to confer on those students and others who study to be may be deemed worthy of honors and degrees such as are pursued. usually conferred in kindred institutions of a literary character; Provided, the student of medicine shall have devoted three
